

## 2016 Curly Flat Pinot Noir

## **Tasting Note**

Bouquet: Dark fruits, roasted quinces and sweet cinnamon lead, alongside an edge of fresh tobacco leaves, forming a rich, fragrant and savoury nose.

Palate: A concentrated, energetic palate with cherries and plum characters front and centre. A long lingering finish, awash with soft, mouth coating tannins.

Cellaring: Approachable now but undoubtedly one for the cellar. An easy 10, if not 15 years lay ahead.

## Season notes

Summer was consistently warm, but not hot, with only one day exceeding 40° at our vineyards. Most days were in the low 30s or less. The season started earlier and maintained an intensity throughout. The combination of our site and the 2016 season have combined to form powerful wines of concentration while maintaining the tension and

length to age gracefully for many years to come.

It's a dry, measured, slightly savoury version of Curly Flat Pinot Noir. There's volume and power to the mid palate but the characterisation is found more so in the wine's spicy, autumnal highlights – combined with trademark velvety texture. **Campbell Mattinson**, The Wine Front **93+ points** 

Open and generous with incredible palate softness and fine-framing tannins. Good varietal definition and clarity. There's a mix of red and dark fruit with an appealing cherry stone thread.
